## THE PROBLEM: Downtime for service and repairs costs operators money

The average crane is operated 48 weeks a year, 5 ½ hours a day. A crane should be greased every 40 hours of operation, which on a standard crane, takes two people, and cannot be done while the crane is in use. The result is lost 'uptime hours.' So, owners/ operators don't do regular maintenance because they have to stay competitive and on-the-job. Cranes break down from overuse and a) cost the owner to repair or b) cost the manufacturer to repair via warranty. In both cases, it costs the owner through lost working hours and revenue – which could be in excess of \$22,000 per day.







With Fascan's exclusive maintenance program, every Fassi SE Boom Crane – a model specially designed to transport and handle wallboard – has its automatic lubrication systems checked and refilled, its hoses checked, and its filters replaced four times each year for three years. And Fascan pays the bill. These are the elements most susceptible to wear during usual crane usage, and the ones most in need of regular maintenance.

Fascan sends notifications by mail and email to remind owners and operators to perform its own on-site maintenance on the crane's greasing mechanism, which on the Fassi crane can be done by one person while the equipment is in use.

On top of that, Fascan pays the SE Crane owner about \$830 per quarter for the life of the agreement toward maintenance expenses, with a bottom line of \$10,000 paid out per crane through the end of the three-year-period.



## THE PROGRAM: The process is simple and easy

On a quarterly basis, FASCAN International, Inc. will reimburse the lesser of actual cost or \$833.34 for SE crane maintenance.
